Why would I want to be on the RCQG executive?

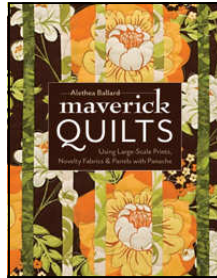
1. It's fun

Maverick Quilts Using Large-Scale Prints, Novelty Fabrics & Panels with Panache

“A maverick is a person who doesn't do things the way everyone else does and is okay with that. I break the rules. I sew odd fabrics together, sew crookedly, buy fabric without a plan in mind, and I have even given quilts away without attaching a label! Ooo!” So says Alethea Ballard in her introduction to this book. Did I get you attention?

Her section on – Use That Fabric — is wonderful. The pictures that go along with her instructions are in colour and definitely add to the understanding of what she is trying to teach. There is a section of basic quilting and the projects that follow after are actual doable. Best of all I like her sense of humour. The way she writes gives you a smile and squelches any misgivings you might have about tackling large-print fabrics. Very enjoyable!
