RCQG Executive Reports for 2013-2014

PRESIDENT: **Nancy Wells** presided over all guild meetings and 6 out of 7 executive meetings; sewed gift bags, wrote welcome notes and prepared Invitational Blocks for new members, answered guild e-mails, picked up monthly mail and wrote monthly messages for inclusion in the RCQG newsletter. A special thanks to Joanne Ariss for taking my place at the October executive meeting and for her assistance with a variety of tasks throughout the year. Thanks to all the members of the Executive for their time and efforts over the past two years. They have done a wonderful job.

PAST PRESIDENT: **Susan Harrington** attended monthly executive meetings, booked meeting spaces for both guild and executive meetings, renewed the guild insurance, procured nominations for the upcoming guild year and revised the guild standing rules and timeline sheets.

VICE PRESIDENT: **Joanne Ariss** attended all executive meetings but one, assisted the President whenever required, assured that the guild quilt was cared for, stored and displayed at several guild meetings, greeted new members at the membership table, introduced them to other members, reserved them a seat near the front for their first meeting and showed them around the meeting room pointing out our bulletin board, workshop sign up table, etc. Attended the Interguild meeting in April with two other RCQG members and brought back valuable information and ideas for the guild.

SECRETARY: **Anna Dawczyk** enjoyed her second year as secretary. She attended monthly executive meetings, recorded the minutes for the meetings and then distributed them to the executive members prior to the next meeting. She also attended and wrote minutes for the June and September AGM meetings.

PROGRAM: **Chair Barbara Jordan with Committee Members Stephanie Moddison, Nancy McNab, Judy Eckhardt, Hazel Switzer and Monica Bell** secured speakers for the 2013/14 Guild season as they did in the previous one. January's Demo Night and March's Spotlight on Members were as popular this year as ever. Backup programs were in place in case of cancellations and were called upon this year. Ending this committee's second year will be a program in June by the Singing Quilter, Cathy Miller, and her husband. The September, October and May programs are in place for the 2014/15 Program Chairs and contacts have been made for additional programs. All executive meetings were attended.

WORKSHOP: **Chair Helen Donaldson with Committee Members Jackie James, Nancy McNab, Barb Kuczynski and Cindy Kinnon.** Throughout the 2013/14 year workshops were given by Anita Zobens on the workings of various threads in our sewing machines and the thread challenges that occur, by Susan Harrington on her methods for successful machine appliqué, by Helen Fujiki on free motion machine quilting tips and techniques and by Cathy Miller on the Mock Mola Reverse Appliqué technique. Helen also attended the Interguild Meeting in April of this year in order to obtain ideas and information for the guild.

MEMBERSHIP: **Co-chairs Ruth Jennison and Noelle Green-Willms with Committee Members Wendy Oskam, Anne Peters and Linda and Keith Baldrey.** There are 121 members registered at present, one of these being a newsletter only membership. Fifty-four guests attended our meetings from September to April. Early registration in June brought in 79 return memberships. From those 79 members one free membership and one free workshop were awarded in a draw. 125 directories were printed and distributed. Any remaining ones will be distributed to new members in the fall.

SPECIAL PROJECTS: Monica Bell oversaw the raffle of a Scrappy 36 Patch quilt donated by Sandy Campbell that raised \$330 for the guild and was won by Laura Murr, procured door prizes for the 23rd Guild Anniversary meeting in March, oversaw the raffle of a design wall donated by Susan Harrington that raised \$183 for the guild and was won by Remy Heard and attended the Interguild meeting in April of this year in order to obtain ideas and information for the guild.

LIBRARIAN: Laurel Marsolais with Committee Members Louise Marshall, Ann Jeffrey and Colleen Hunter. Laurel added more than 20 books to the library in addition to a variety of new magazines, wrote book reports on new book purchases for the newsletter, instituted a monthly book sale of donated magazines and books that proved to be quite successful, started a ruler library with generous donations from members and attempted to increase library usage by opening the library earlier with great results.

NEWSLETTER: Mary Anne Girouard attended monthly executive meetings and prepared the Guild Newsletter throughout the Guild year except for October and April when Susan Knabenschuh prepared them in her absence, notified members by e-mail that the newsletters had been posted on the website, mailed copies of the newsletter to several members who do not have email and provided a colour copy of the newsletter to the guild Historian.

HISTORIAN: Edna Keown was present at all but one executive meeting, attended all guild meetings where photos of the Speaker's works and 'Show and Tell' participants and their works were taken, compiled these photos into an album, emailed photos to the members who requested it and produced a poster with photos of the executive to be displayed at each meeting.

PUBLICITY: Lisa Jones informed the local newspapers and CJOY of monthly meeting dates, put up posters in September about monthly guild meetings, had bookmarks redesigned so they were generic and useable from year to year, had bookmarks made for special guest Cathy Miller (the speaker at our June meeting), promoted the Library displays of guild quilts and worked with a team of volunteers to create displays at five Guelph libraries in May.

OUTREACH: Chair Linda deVries with Committee Members/Helpers Susan Birkholz, Lisa Jones, Cyndy Maltby, Wendy Oskam, Carol Cousins, Dana Scott, Karen Heal, Joan Hett and Lorelei Stinson. As a parting comment on the Outreach program at our guild, I have been pleased and proud to have been a part of this Committee. The ladies of my committee and the membership have big hearts and are so willing to help when called upon. In the last two years we have collectively donated more than 100 quilts to the Guelph General Hospital's Sexual Assault Unit. Thank you to all who played a role and made all of this happen. As we move forward, I know we will continue to be generous with our time and talents.

WEBSITE: Susan Knabenschuh continued to update the Guild Website. The website presented a new look this year and a "calendar" on the home page was one of the enhancements. A user manual was created for this position. Newsletters were posted monthly. Updates were added throughout the year.

e.g. *What are miniature quilts? Generally, they are quilts that are no longer than 24" on each side.*

Use a mini iron to press the seams.

Use a straight stitch feed plate to help prevent fabric jams and tangled stitches.
