President's Message





We love to see what everyone in the Guild is working on, so don't be shy, show us what you are working on or have completed. We love to see them along with their stories.



Book Review

Patchwork comforters, throws & quilts
 edited by Jeanne Stauffer
 and Sandra L. Hatch



It's safe to say that a lot of quilt books are a lot of same-old, same-old. This book features patchwork, but the difference in this book is the projects. Think table runners, but wider and longer and able to keep your feet extra warm during the cold winter nights, and they are the perfect size to wrap yourself in when you need some extra comfort! The editors have included seven different patterns, including a beautiful Sashiko version with circles of Asian fabrics. There are seven quilt patterns that use pre-cut rolls and squares and several innovative appliqué patterns including a beautiful quilt with irises in various colours, a scrappy hexagon quilt with stars appliquéd in the border, and a charm square quilt with a border appliquéd with rickrack, butterflies and flowers. The book finishes up with several adorable quilt patterns for babies, including quilts with kites, hearts and bears.

Becky Goldsmith of Piece O' Cake Designs entertained us with her thoughts on colour through overhead projections, amusing stories and beautiful quilts.
