During the week of Sept. 23- 27, my husband and I travelled north to Sault Saint Marie, ON to ride on the Algoma Central Line up to the Agawa Canyon. While planning your next quilt, whether it is a baby quilt, a quilt for our Outreach program, a quilt for Christmas or any special event, keep in mind the importance of contrast. You will likely be much more satisfied with your end result. Happy quilting!

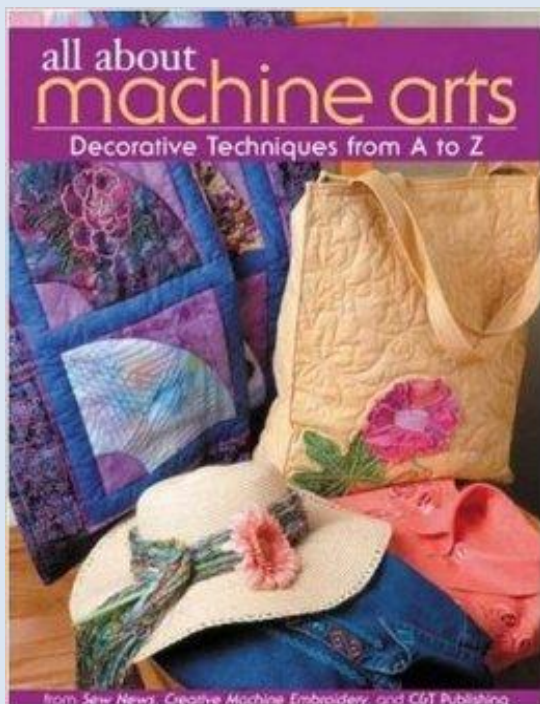
This quilt will be on display at the November and December meetings.

Book Review

All About Machine Arts: Decorative Techniques from A to Z by C&T Publishing



This book is rated at 5 stars by customers on Amazon.com, and it is no surprise. Beginners and veterans will find a wealth of information and ideas. The book begins with a gallery of inspiration, from art quilts to clothing and home décor items. If something catches your eye, just check out the pages for that creation to learn more. Each section guides you to everything you need to know. For example, if the technique uses a stabilizer, you are told which page will teach you about that, what threads to use and how to set up your machine as well as tips and tricks to ensure success.

Some of the topics covered include: appliqué, beading by machine, free-motion stitching, machine spun lace, metalwork, Sashiko by machine, trapunto by machine, and a great section on "Waste not" (how to mask the shortcomings of a fabric and find just the right use for it).

There are also sections on mastering your sewing machine, the essentials (fabric, thread and stabilizers), successful studios, and terrific tools to help you complete every project.

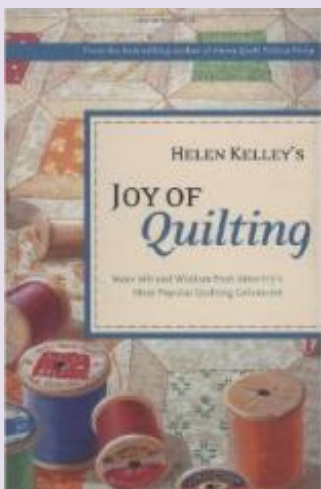
