Width from 48" to 54"

Length from 54" to 66"

Our batts are pre-cut to 60" x 72"

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## Block of the Month

### Card Trick Block

Fabric Required/Supplied (kits will be available at the Outreach Table)

Patch A = 4 - 3 1/2" squares

Patch B = 4 - 3 1/2" X 6 1/2" rectangles

Patch C = 2 - 5" squares (background fabric), cut each square diagonally once (four corner triangles).

Patch D = 1 - 5 1/2" square (background fabric) Cut diagonally twice (4 small triangles).

Note: Four different fabrics can be used for each of the four parts. We have chosen to use 2 fabrics.

Use the same background fabric for Patches C & D.

Use a scant 1/4" seam allowance.

PLEASE do not trim the block. The approximate finished size is 12 3/4" by 12 3/4". Bigger is acceptable.

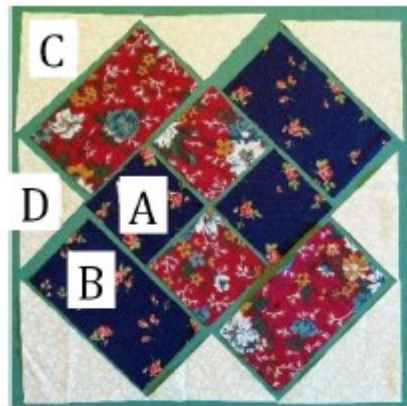

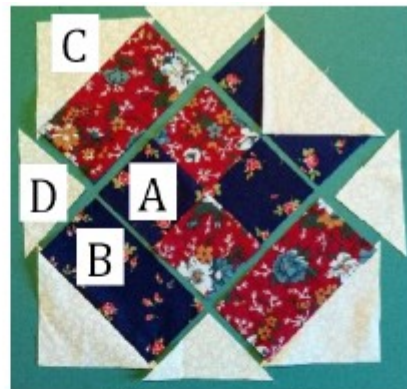

1. Layout the pieces as shown in Diagram 1. Sew together the four Patch A squares, this is the centre block.
2. Sew a background Patch C triangle to each of the Patch B rectangles. Align the triangle centre with the centre of the rectangle to sew. Press seams toward triangle.
3. Sew the 2 blue/background Patch B-C units to opposite sides of the centre Patch A unit. Press seams towards rectangles.
4. Sew a background Patch D triangle to the short sides of the burgundy Patch B-C units. Press seams open.
5. Join the last 2 burgundy Patch B-C units to the centre block. Match the rectangle seams to those of the four-patch in the centre. Press seams open.

In September 2018, at a Fibre Arts group meeting, a few pictures of group work that had successfully made it into some of the big name quilt shows were passed around. Within two weeks the photo had been enlarged to 4ft by 3ft and eight ladies who were willing to work to a series of deadlines were given a section of the photo and sent home to create.

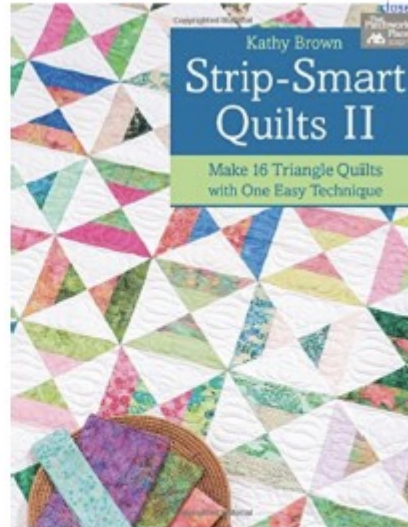
I've said it many times and I'll say it again. Well done, ladies!

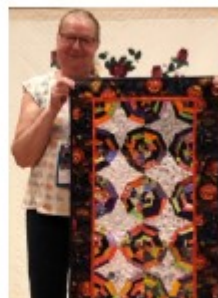
