- Adding a rule about selecting a qualified reviewer for the Guild's financial records;
- Adding specific language requiring Committee Chairs to seek approval from the Executive prior to incurring expenses beyond their approved budget;
- Aligning the membership procedures with the membership year defined by the by-laws;
- Increasing guidance for fundraising efforts; and,
- Making minor changes in wording to increase clarity.

At this time, we have delivered 46 completed quilts to two of the residential sites: Grace Gardens and Bellevue.

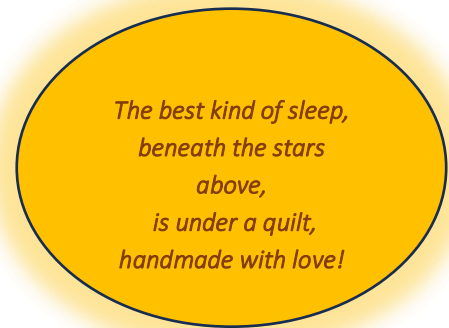

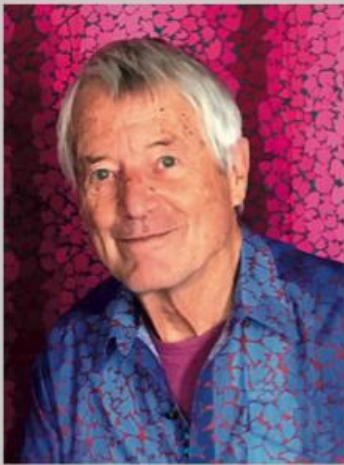

Film at Five Free Pattern (October-November)



In October and November, the Stash Busters will be using their scrap fabrics to make the popular Film at Five quilt from the Wedding Dress Blue blog. For an 86.5" x 86.5" quilt, use the tutorial at: [Wedding Dress Blue](#).

Many of us will remember the old projectors in our schools and the Film at Five pattern reflects the film running through the projector as our teachers showed us movies on geography, science, history, or animals etc.

The picture, at left, shows scraps on a light background, but as you will see in the pattern, dark choices can be effective too. Join the group, as led by Sue Foard, to sew this project In October and November.

You will be able to use 2-1/2" squares or 2-1/2" strips from your stash for this project. A reference chart for fabric requirements is included below.

The Electric Quilt Company has spent over 30 years developing their quilt design software and EQ8 is a powerful tool! Have you purchased the software, but don't use all the features? That's the situation that prompted the formation of our groups! We don't 'teach' the software - you will need to understand the basic tools and 'lingo' to follow along with the conversations, but we believe you will learn 'useful' stuff that just might help you craft even more interesting designs!



Our "original" user group meets at 7:00 - 8:30pm (ET) on the 4th Tuesday of September, November, January, March, and May. This group has completed available course books and are now pursuing group challenges and discussions of 'alternate' ways to draft designs. Cheryl Cowan and Becky Fiedler facilitate this group.

The "new" user group meets at 9:30 - 11:00am, every other Friday, commencing September 15th. This group is currently working together to complete the exercises in the EQ8 "Designing Quilts" book (Chapter 6, to be precise). They will then be moving onto the EQ8 "Drawing Blocks" book. Flo Belford coordinates this group.

Dayna Passmore picked up the top and delivered it to Joan Hug-Valeriotte. Joan then completed the complementary machine quilting. Jan Snell added the final binding.



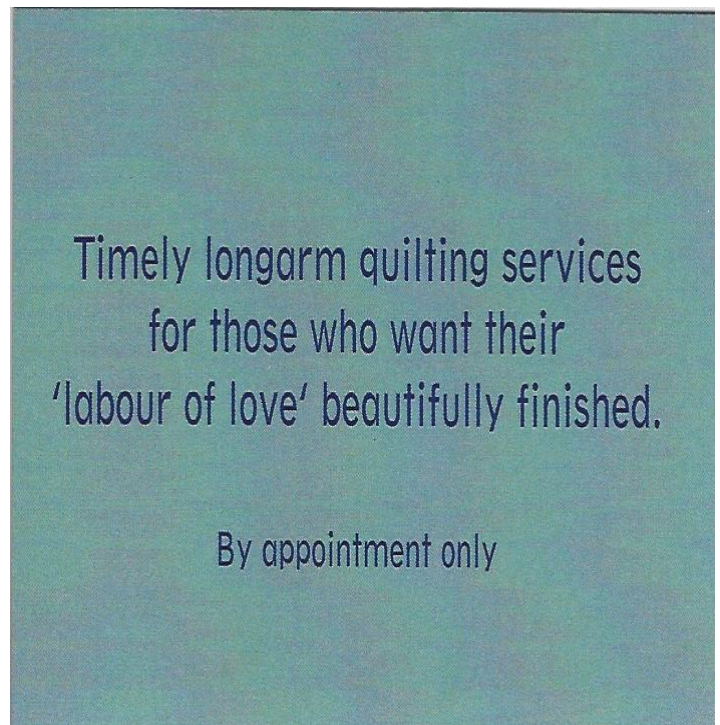
Ultimately, Joan brought the quilt back to Hospice Wellington, where she presented the finished donation to Pat Stuart. William's dream of a finished quilt, in Anne's memory, has been realized, as of July, 2023!

The original St. Patrick's Ward area is bounded by the Eramosa and Speed Rivers, the CN tracks along the escarpment above Elizabeth St. and Victoria Rd. Festival organizers hope this will become an annual event.
