Tube Piecing – Beyond Bargello

Irena Swanson has been developing her tube piecing methodology for several years. She has used it to make many varied projects quickly, efficiently, and accurately. She's written countless articles and books on her method. In her Easy Geometric Quilts with Tube Piecing, she breaks down the basic steps so that others may follow her passion. Bonus, you do not need to buy any new gadgets!!!


Irena will encourage you to experience quilting from a new point of view: it is often about cutting large constructions down rather than building from small pieces up. Tube piecing is an enhanced version of strip piecing and permits the maker to conquer more unusual shapes, like triangles and parallelograms.

Home For Good

The Home for Good table was busy during the September Mingle. We received a dozen completed quilts and half a dozen quilts ready to move to the next phase. Quilters sewed on labels and sewed down bindings throughout the day.

Sue Turnbull came all the way from Ottawa to hand deliver a bright, cheerful plaid quilt. It was her first quilt-as-you-go quilt and she did an amazing job (picture at right).

At present this program has already delivered 42 quilts and there are 27 quilts ready to be delivered when the third facility opens. We have 9 quilts currently out for quilting and 8 out for binding. That brings us to a total of 86 quilts and we are aware of a few more that have been promised and should arrive shortly. Considering that we embarked on this program only this Spring, this is an enormous accomplishment.

Congratulations to all our quilters, both in the Guild and further afield. Thanks also to the Guelph Lions Club for their support of this initiative. --- Ann Jeffrey

Edyta Sitar's Alaska Quiltalong - Starts October 21st


