- **May 10** – Members will receive a link with instructions on how to view the virtual quilt show and vote for their favourite quilt.
- **June 2** – Voting will close.
- **June 9** – The Viewer's Choice Award will be announced at the Members' Meeting.



Please note: A "For Display Only" category will be included in the quilt show. This option is available for members who would like to share their work but prefer not to participate in the quilt challenge. In addition, to avoid any potential conflict of interest, members of the Executive have chosen to refrain from participating in the Viewer's Choice voting. However, they may submit photos of their creations for everyone to see and enjoy in the quilt show.

We look forward to seeing the wonderful quilts our members create, and to celebrating this special anniversary together.

Just as importantly, WEFTFest allows us to spotlight some of the causes that are dear to us. Our Outreach quilts represent partnerships, generosity, and the belief that quilts can bring comfort, dignity, and hope. By participating in this event, we are not only showcasing beautiful work — we are highlighting the important work of our partner organizations.

Community Outreach

Our Guild outreach program donated this gorgeous, modified rail fence quilt to the Guelph Tool Library. Our donation will be included in a silent auction portion of the Brush Battle fundraiser on the 11th of April.

The library offers tools of all kinds including sewing machines, kitchen appliances and construction equipment. By sharing tools and assisting patrons, in repairing their belongings, patrons save money and items are diverted from landfill.

The Guelph Tool Library also provides DIY bike repair services and a seed library to support community gardens. It is great addition to the city, and a great organization for us to support through our outreach program.

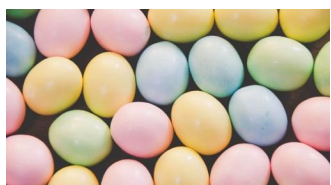


Library Report

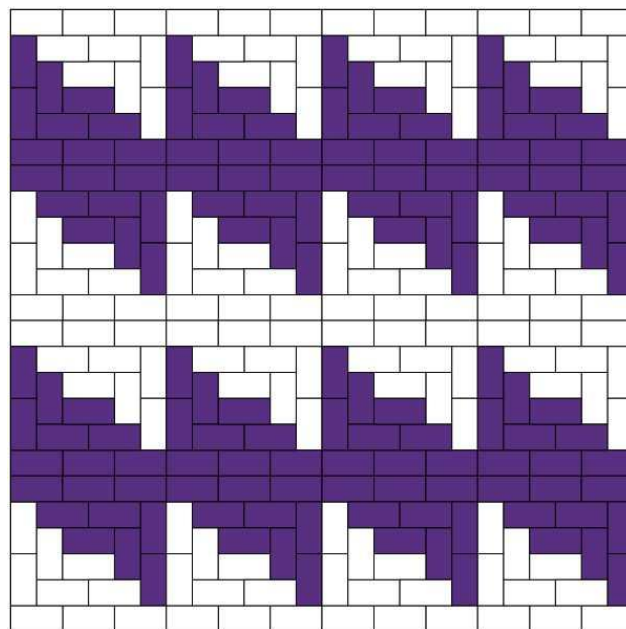
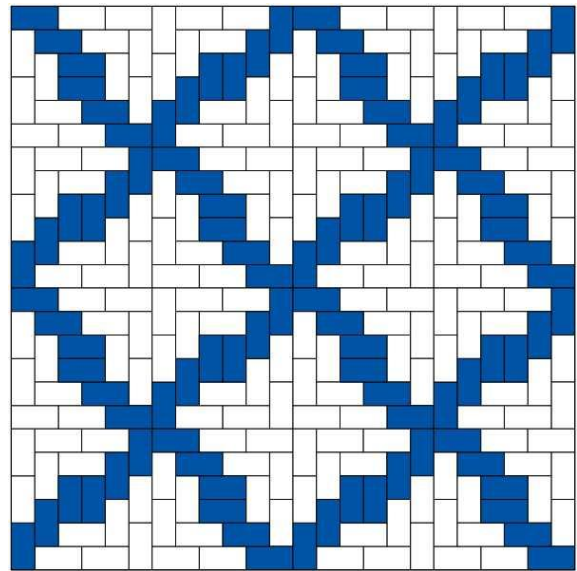
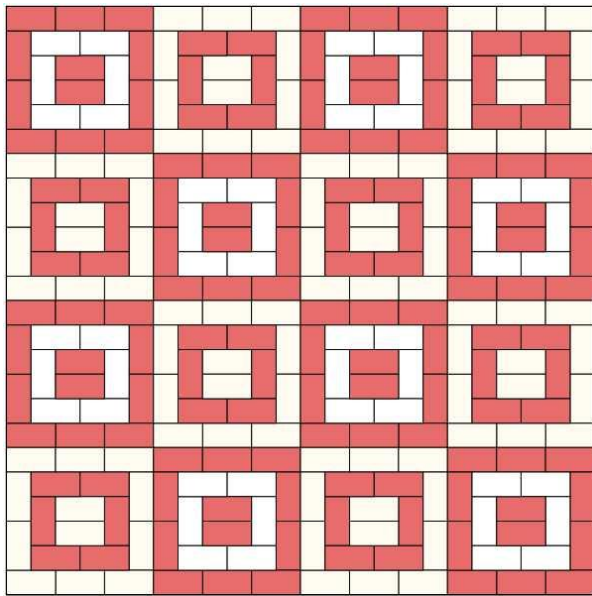
Stash Busters

If you already have fabric "potato chips" cut, please feel free to have them on hand. Stephanie suggests waiting until after her presentation before cutting more, so you can move forward with a clear plan.

Optional Label Idea: Add a Slice of Everyday Life

Many quilters make quilts for special occasions—births, weddings, and other milestone events. But quilt labels can also capture a small slice of everyday life.

Some quilters include details about daily life at the time the quilt was made—such as the price of a common item like gasoline or bread. These small details can help future viewers understand what life was like when the quilt was created.



In recent *Tula Tuesday* videos, designer Tula Pink talked about labelling two of her recent quilts and how she adds a bit of everyday context to her work.

In the first video, she shows a quilt she is preparing to send to her exhibit at the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky. The quilt is a stunning example of an integrated label. As Tula says, “The quilt *is* the label.”

Tula also has a personal labelling tradition: she includes the average price of gasoline on the back of her quilts. In the second video, she explains what inspired her to start doing this and shows the playful label she designed just for that purpose. She also talks about the pattern and designer of the quilt, and shares a very special gift she recently received.

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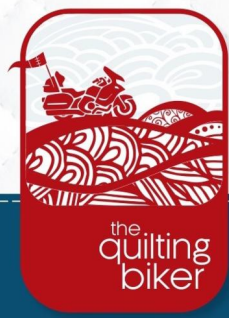
